

Frank M. Muller, Jr.



Presently Frank Muller is a Senior Advisor to an advanced regenerative medicine company as well as a international oil and gas services company in Houston.

In 2002, Frank Muller '65 became president of Toby Enterprises, which is a medical tech and high tech investment company focused on start-ups in the southwest region of the United States. He retired in 2001 as senior vice president of the Coastal Corporation, an \$11 billion energy-related conglomerate.

Muller was chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Ten X Technology, Inc., and chief executive officer for 29 years until 2009.

Muller received his bachelor's degree from Texas A&M University in 1965 and graduated first in his MBA class from Texas A&M in 1971. He has 40 additional graduate hours in finance and management. Upon graduation from Texas A&M in 1965, Muller served eight years on active duty with multiple tours to Vietnam earning 17 awards for valor in airborne infantry assignments.

After active duty, Muller worked for the chairman of PepsiCo as executive assistant. Muller operated four different companies for PepsiCo and then served as senior vice president of International Operations for the Williams Company. Subsequently, he formed an international petrochemical/fertilizer company that operated for more than seven years in the Middle East and the Far East.

Muller is on 9 boards at TAMU-he started in company E-2 and was Student Body President his senior year. Currently he serves on two public boards and 4 private boards.

His A&M activities include the Chancellor's Advisory Council, President's Advisory Council Chairman, Corps Development Council, CIBS and PERC. Also Chair of the Medical College Leadership Board, Co-Chair Bush Development Board, and past Chairman of the President's Board of Visitors.

Wife Sharon went to heaven in July 2012 and they have 3 Aggie adult children and 7 grandchildren. In 1992, he was awarded "Distinguished Alumnus" by Texas A&M University and received the Hall of Honor Award in 2001.
